IMPORTANT NOTICE

RAGGING - AN OFFENCE

Ragging in any form, in any place or time is a cognizable offence that will attract severe punishment including summary expulsion from the College/University/Institution. Extract of Tamil Nadu Government gazette extraordinary dated 29.01.2997 (bill no. 8 of 1997 Tamilnadu prohibition of Ragging act)

1. In this act, unless the context otherwise requires, "Ragging" means display of noisy, disorderly conduct, doing any act which causes or is likely to cause physical or psychological harm or raise apprehension of fear or shame or embarrassment to a student in any educational institution and includes:

(a). Teasing or abusing or playing practical jokes on or causing hurt to such students; or (b). Asking the student to do any act or perform something which such student will not, in the ordinary course, willingly act or perform

2. Ragging within or outside the institution is prohibited.

3. Whoever directly or indirectly participates in or supports "Ragging" within or outside any educational institution, shall be punished with imprisonment for a term which may extend to two years and shall also be liable to a fine which may extend to Rs. 10,000.

4. Any student convicted of an offence under section 4 shall also be dismissed from the Institution and such student will not be admitted in any other educational institution.

5. Without prejudice to the foregoing provisions, whenever any student complaints of Ragging to the head of the educational institution, or to any other person responsible for the management of the educational institution shall enquire into the same immediately and if found true shall suspend the student who has committed the offence from the educational institution.

COUNSELLING

- 1. A small group of students is assigned to each faculty, who offers them regular counselling on academic and personal matters.
- Two unit tests and one model examination in each subject will be conducted regularly. No student is exempted from writing test/ examinations. Absence without valid reasons will not be entertained.
- 3. The parent/guardian is kept informed periodically of their ward's academic and attendance progress.

PROJECT AND TRAINING

Most of the final year students carry out project works in various reputed organizations like SPIC, NLC, BHEL, SHAR Centre, WIPRO, GEC, EID (Parry), Atomic Power station IGCAR etc.

INDUSTRIAL VISITS AND INPLANT TRAINING

Regular Industrial visits and In-plant training programmes are arranged to expose the students to the practical environments and real life problems, by all the departments.

DEPARTMENT OF TRAINING AND PLACEMENT

This is headed by a senior faculty member. The department has got three wings viz. Training and Placement cell, Bureau of Higher Education and Centre for Industry-Institute Collaboration (CIIC).

The Training and Placement cell provides career guidance and counselling, conducts soft skills Development Programs, provides information on employment opportunities and arranges for placement of students through the campus recruitment.

The Bureau of Higher Education (BHE) is an information bank on higher education both in India and abroad. It organizes introductory seminars on TOEFL, GRE, GMAT and GATE for the benefit of students. BHE identifies staff from Departments as Mentors for those students preparing for GATE with effective counselling and guidance in GATE preparations. It organizes coaching for TOEFL and GRE with eminent resource persons.

Centre for Industry-Institute Collaboration assists in identifying companies/organizations for Final year Students projects. It helps to contact various

organizations (both Public and Private sectors) and arranges in-plant training during summer/winter vacations. CIIC promotes Industry-Institute interaction by working closely with CII, FICCI and AIMO

FINE ARTS CLUB

RULES AND REGULATIONS

PERFORMANCE AND CONDUCT

Students are to be punctual and regular for the classes and submit assignments, records, home work etc., in time.

Students are to maintain strict silence in the classes and labs and must not wander around.

- Students are to maintain good academic progress and good conduct. Students are expected to develop the habit of wishing inmates, faculty and elders.
- Students are to equip themselves with approved drawing materials, instrument boxes and record notebooks as required.
- Ragging in any form is illegal and strictly forbidden.
- Severe action will be taken against those who indulge in ragging, strike or any such undesirable activities.
- > There is a grievance redressal mechanism and issues are to be thus sorted out.
- Lab equipment should be handled carefully as per laid down instructions and generally with precautions. Students will have to pay for the breakages, if any.
- Students are advised to know the location of main Switch of Labs concerned as a safety measure.
- Safety Norms are to be adopted in day to day working.
- ➤ Any malfunctioning and damage of equipments must be informed to lab instructors.
- Prior permission is required from lab-in-charge for doing experiments project work in extra lab hours.
- Students should not absent for any classes and restricted to go bank or any other work during working hours.
- Students are expected to submit the records in respect of a particular experiment during the next laboratory class.

> The observation note books should be ready before the commencement of any experiment. Students should get the readings / calculations approved at the end of the lab session.

COLLEGE TIMING

The normal class hours for students are from 09.20 a.m. to 04.30 p.m. with a 20 minutes tea break and one hour lunch break. They can avail library facility till 6.00p.m.

DRESS CODE

- Male students are to wear trousers and tucked-in-shirts and not permitted to wear T-shirts, Jeans.
- Female students are to wear Churidars with duppattas neatly pinned. Half Sarees, skirts, jeans, frocks or any other indecent tight fitting dresses are not permitted. No loose garments are permitted in the workshop / laboratories.
- Footwear used should be securely strapped at the heel. All students are to wear leather shoes in the workshops and also over coats as required.
- Wearing Hawai Slippers is prohibited from the point of view of safety and decency

IDENTITY CARD

- Students are required to wear their Identity Cards (easily noticeable) whenever they are in the college campus and also when they travel using the college transport.
- > Not wearing the identity card will be considered as an act of indiscipline.

ATTENDANCE

A candidate will be permitted to appear for the University examinations, only if he/she

- 1. Secures required attendance percentage
- 2. Maintains satisfactory academic progress and
- 3. Maintains good conduct.
- Attendance in tests and model examinations is compulsory. Leave will be granted in exceptional cases for valid reasons like hospitalization.
- > The attendance rules given below will be strictly followed.
 - 1. Below 74%

-Not permitted to appear for University Examinations.

2. 75 % and above

-Allowed to appear for University Examinations

3. Leave on medical grounds:

-Attendance should not fall below 75% for the semester for reasons other than medical grounds. Medical leave will be accepted only in genuine cases with a proper medical certificate from a Doctor submitted immediately after the leave. However, even in medical leave case, the attendance shall not fall below 65% which is minimum for attending University examinations. If attendance falls below 65% even with Medical Leave, students are not permitted to appear for the University Examination and they have to repeat the Semester.

LEAVE REGULATIONS

- Leave letters should be counter signed by parents / guardians / hostel warden. Leave letters on medical grounds should be accompanied by Medical Certificate.
- Generally prior permission should be obtained before availing leave.
- Whenever prior permission could not be obtained, the leave letter should be submitted within 2 days after reporting to the college or within 4 days from the commencement of leave whichever is earlier.
- A student absent for one period shall be treated as absent for the complete session.
 (Forenoon or Afternoon during that day)
- ▶ If a student absent for special classes, will lose attendance for the whole day.
- > All the students should be present on the reopening day.
- During the Semester after the First week, two days of absence with leave letter will be permitted in a calendar month.

ACADEMIC PROGRESS

- 50% or more marks in each subject will be considered as satisfactory performance in class tests and model examinations.
- Internal Assessment of 20 Marks has been introduced by the Anna University. This will be calculated based on the marks scored in the tests / assignments / class works.
- If the students have not completed the assignment (subject wise), attendance will not be given till they submit the assignment

The cases of students who have poor academic performance or inadequate attendance will be reviewed at staff council meeting every week / month. In case of default, counseling will be done. After second default, they will not be recommended for campus placement / given letter of recommendations for higher studies.

CERTIFICATES

The original certificates submitted by students at the time of admission to the college will be returned after completion of all registration / recognition / Approval processes at the University / DOTE. The course completion certificate, transfer certificate and conduct certificate will be issued only when the students complete the course satisfactorily and leave the college

GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS

- Mobile Phones are not allowed in college premises. Failure to adhere to this instruction will lead to disciplinary action.
- Students are advised to participate in in-house / outside conferences and seminars and present technical papers with the guidance and prior permission of HOD / Principal.
- Students are encouraged to participate in extracurricular activities with prior permission of appropriate authorities of college.
- Students should give Photo Copies of certificates / hand over trophies to HOD / Staff in-charge of activities.
- Students are advised to give their suggestions and feedback regarding their difficulties either directly to the class in-charge / HOD / Principal or through the suggestion box, provided at the all departments.
- Loss / Theft of ID Cards / Library Cards and change of Address or Contact Mobile Numbers should be informed to HOD/ college office without delay.
- Students are advised to :
 - i. Maintain general hygiene while in canteens and throw the wastes only in Dustbins.
 - ii. During class hours, students should not go to canteens.
- > All hostel students are to abide by Rules / Regulations of the Hostel

HOSTEL RULES AND REGULATIONS

- A responsible person viz., parent or guardian who will comply with the formalities and procedures of admitting/vacating the hostel, must accompany candidates seeking admission for hostel accommodation. No inmate will be allowed to vacate the hostel in the middle of the academic year or semester.
- No student will be allowed to stay in the hostel without formal admission. Any inmate will automatically become the Member of Mess. The hostel is not available for lodging alone.
- The inmate of the hostel should not normally stay in the hostel during college working hours. In case they have to stay in the hostel due to sickness, they should apply for leave as per college rules, informing warden, the reasons for staying in the hostel during working hours.
- Inmates of the hostel are expected to be in their rooms before 6.30 p.m. They will not be permitted to enter / leave the hostel after this time limit. Roll call will be taken at the specified time by the wardens. In case, the inmates have to use the library or computer labs, they shall obtain permission from the warden.
- No inmate shall absent himself / herself from the hostel without prior permission from the warden and the HOD on the basis of requests from parents / local guardian.
- Strict silence should be observed between 10.00 p.m. and 5.00 a.m., except during the dinner time
- The names of hostelinmates who absent themselves for 15 consecutive days without prior permission will be struck off from the rolls. Leave / absence will be granted only at the request of the Parent / Guardian.
- The inmates are to take care of hostel property and not cause damage to any hostel property. The cost of damages caused in the room or in the premises will be recovered from the inmates responsible.
- Ragging in any form is illegal and is strictly prohibited, and it is a punishable offense.
- > The inmates must strictly adhere to the specified timings of the mess.
- Food will not be served in rooms and inmates are not allowed to take food to their rooms.

- If an inmate is ill, the same should be reported to the warden, who will then make suitable arrangements to take care of that inmate.
- > Day scholars, friends, Parents/Guests are not permitted to stay in the hostel
- Strict discipline in the dining hall should be maintained and food is not to be shared from the same plate / wasted / littered.
- Electrical switches must be put off, whenever not required or while going out of room.
- Inmates are advised not to keep valuables / cash in the hostel / room but are to deposit in Post Office / Savings Bank account.
- Each inmate should see that the room occupied by her / him is kept neat and clean. There is a Complaint Register with the Wardens for registering Complaints on Hygiene and Repairs.
- Any candidate who once reserves his/her seat by paying the fee for hostel accommodation, will not be eligible for refund if he / she chooses not to join the hostel.
- Hostel inmates securing less than 85% attendance in a semester, will not be permitted to stay in the hostel. However in exceptional cases permission may be granted as per hostel rule.
- Inmates will be allowed to go home during common holidays and semester holidays. In exceptional cases permission may be granted to stay in the hostels as per hostel rules.
- Inmates coming to hostel in the late evening / night without prior permission from Wardens will be stopped at the main gate itself by the security persons.
- Wearing ID card is MUST at all times inside the campus as a safety measure in the interest of students.
- Study time is must from 6.30 p.m. to 8.00 p.m. & 9.00 p.m. to 10.00 p.m. on all working days and surprise checks will be made by Chief Warden.
